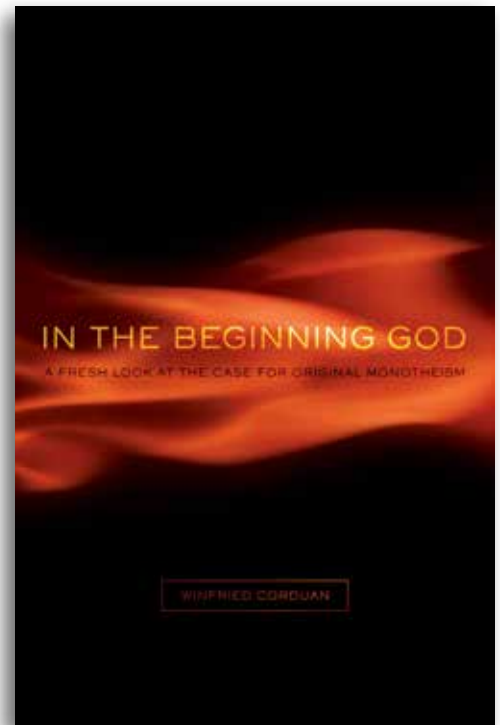
Christians believe religion began when God created human beings and revealed himself to them. But is there scholarly evidence for this belief?

In the nineteenth-century academic world a stormy debate took shape over the origin of religion. A dominant view emerged that religion began with animism—the veneration of spirits—and only later evolved into higher forms, from polytheism on to monotheism. On the basis of discoveries made throughout the world, some scholars challenged the prevailing view, but their work has since been largely ignored. However, the evidence on which these scholars based their conclusion is still there, and the case for an original monotheism still stands.

In the Beginning God educates Christians about the debate—the facts that were accepted and those that were ignored—and how one can put this knowledge to use in making a case for the truth of Christianity.

Western Christianity’s interaction with world religions used to be, for the most part, overseas. Today, “religious others” often live next door. At a changing time when one public prayer spoken during the 2009 U.S. presidential inauguration festivities was addressed to “O god of our many understandings,” the evangelical Christian church should do more than simply dismiss non-Christian religions as pagan without argument or comment. The church needs a theology of religions that is Christ-honoring, biblically faithful, intellectually satisfying, compassionate, and that will encourage Spirit-powered mission. Oregon-based theology professor Todd L. An Explanation of the Writing of the Synoptic Gospels

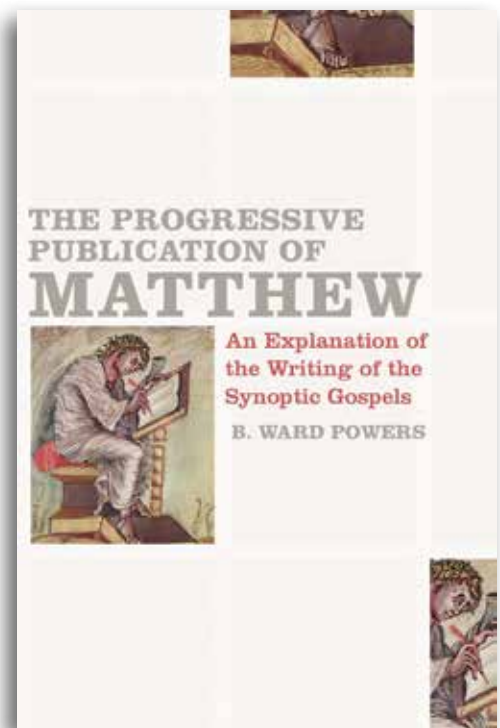

Ward Powers draws attention to the evidence pointing to Matthew’s Gospel having been published progressively, with identifiable sections of his material then being seen and utilized by Luke. After both of these Gospels had been published in their current form, they together with the preaching of the Apostle Peter were the three sources used by Mark in producing a special-purpose Gospel for preachers and evangelists.

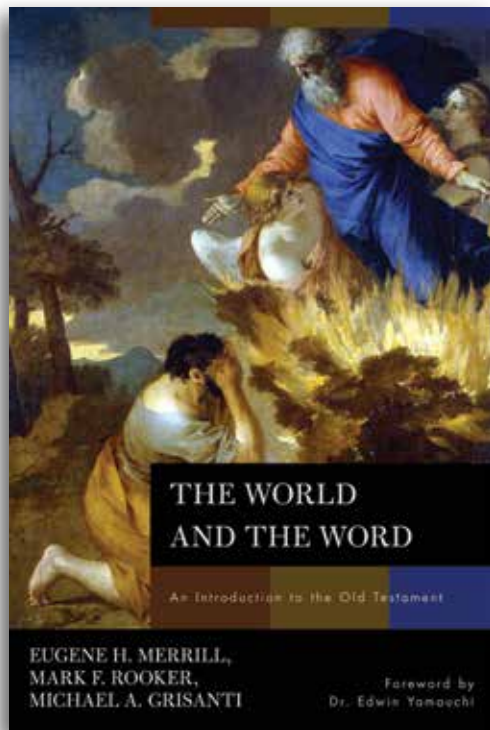
The Progressive Publication of Matthew fleshes out this proposal, measuring it in detail against other hypotheses.

Building on this statistic, the authors of *TransforMission* believe that short-term mission is one way God is taking the gospel to the nations and, concurrently, transforming the lives of these student participants. Writing to youth ministers, missiologists, church leaders, adult volunteers, and post-high school students, Wilder and Parker assess strategies for further promoting this kind of involvement.

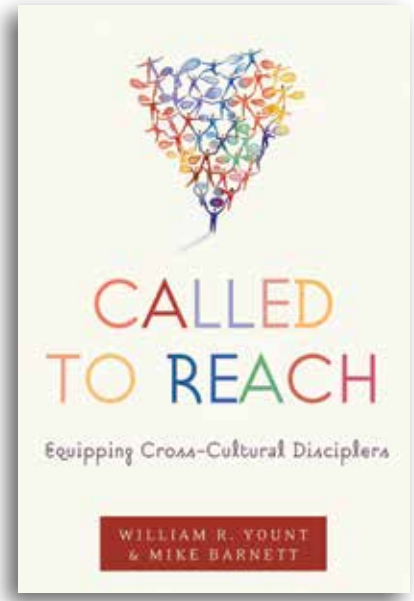
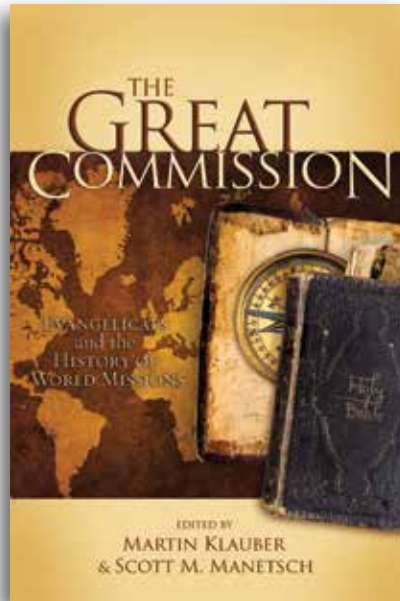
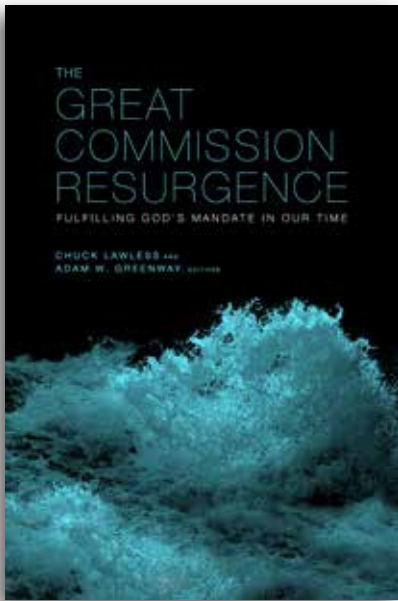

He contends that sermons “need not settle comfortably on the lives of the listeners like dust on a coffee table.” He encourages preachers to join him in casting off the lines that moor their ministries to the status-quo and make every effort to steer their preaching out of the “comfortable shallows.” He urges them to preach deep sermons rather than superficial ones, moving “beyond the yawn-inspiring to the awe-inspiring, from the trite to the transforming.”

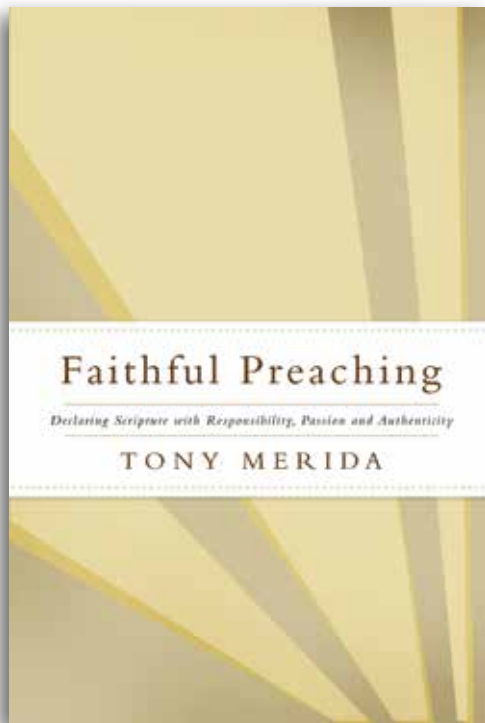

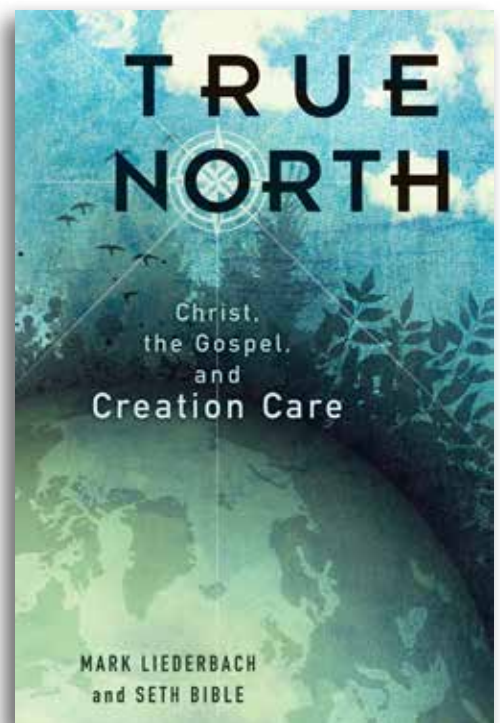
Discussions related to creation care and environmental ethics have become both politically charged and highly controversial.
